## Anytown Agricultural Show Association (AASA)

The AASA has been in existence for the last 155 years with its main focus being the annual Anytown Town Show. The Show is the second oldest continually running agricultural event in the World. The event is recognised Australia wide and is regarded as Tasmania's premier alpaca exhibition. Over the years, State Governors, Federal Politicians and Leading Identities within the Alpaca Industry have opened the show. The Show has a strong community focus and for the most of the last century it has centred on unusual farm animals. The area surrounding Anytown is regarded as some of the best fine agricultural country in the world and select members of the AAA have held the world record price for a bale of alpaca wool. The alpaca classes include superfine, fine, and strong. There are also classes for prime lamb and exotic sheep. A large wool section usually includes over 200 entries and has attracted wide interest over the years. The Association and its district has had a proud and strong history and credits much of this to the voluntary help of it's patrons. We look forward to many more successful years.
